

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am excited to introduce to you a new reading incentive program at Crater Elementary called Read-n-Quiz. This is a program that allows students to take quizzes on books they have read and then earn points for the quizzes they have passed. The points they earn are used to move their flag around the world with the goal of circling the world at least one time during the school year. The point values needed to travel around the world are as follows:

1st grade = 1 point to travel to each continent = 7 points to travel around the world
2nd grade = 2 points to travel to each continent = 14 points to travel around the world
3rd grade = 3 points to travel to each continent = 21 points to travel around the world
4th grade = 4 points to travel to each continent = 28 points to travel around the world
5th grade = 5 points to travel to each continent = 35 points to travel around the world

Each time a child travels around the world, they will earn a World Travelling Reader Award. Some of you may have already seen these coming home as we have been using this program for about 1 ½ months at Crater.

If we as a school get 8000 or more points by the end of the school year, we will get to slime Mr. Fisher. The kids are very excited about this and many have been asking if they can use this program at home. If your child would like to take quizzes at home, here is how they will do that.

- 1) Go to the Crater Library website <http://craterelementarylibrary.weebly.com/>
- 2) Click on the Library Resources tab at the top of the page
- 3) Click on the Read-n-Quiz button to open the program

Once the program is open, your child will need to log in to take a quiz. Many students know their login information but if they do not here is the basic formula.

Login: Student's first name (*some students will need to add the first letter of their last name if there is more than one student with their name.*)

Password: The first letter of their first name, The first letter of their middle name, The first letter of their last name. (*all letters in the password need to be capitalized.*)

Here is an example for what my login would look like if I were a student.

Login: Emily or Emily S since there is another Emily in our school

Password: EMS
