From Mr. Fisher's Desk...

Dear Parents-

As Spring moves further along it may become more difficult for students to focus on school. There are ways to help your child's case of "Springitis". Experts suggest the following:

- 1) Stick to established schedules at home. The family should have dinner at the same time throughout the school year. Children should also do their homework at about the same time throughout the school year. This provides consistency and structure during the entire year so that when days are longer and the weather is nice in the spring, the children know what is expected and will be less likely to abandon their homework.
- 2) Monitor progress more frequently during the homework "hour". This keeps the child working steadily so that homework is done in a timely manner. If the student loses interest in the assignment, the parent should "coach" the child to return to the task. For example, the parent can say, "You only need to finish X number of problems or pages to finish your homework. I know you can finish in X amount of time and then you can have some playtime.
- 3) Provide an incentive for following through on schoolwork. Let the child know he or she can earn more time outdoors if he or she sticks to keeping up with academic responsibilities. Parents can reward their children with a family bike ride or walk in the neighborhood on Friday evening or Saturday morning. This kind of activity builds family togetherness and provides an opportunity to enjoy the great weather. To reinforce following through on schoolwork even further, parents can provide a treat, like strawberries or watermelon, to eat in the backyard after the family activity

I am looking forward to my first ever CRATER CARNIVAL this year.
