Parent Reminder! To those who received an immunization status letter with your child's progress report; please update, sign and return the letter to CVMS no later that January 12, 2011. Some Classroom Happenings!

Math Classes: The State of Oregon has adopted new state standards this year. Every course level will have 3 main focus areas. At this time, Math 1 students are working on numbers and operations. Math 2 students are doing numbers and operations with negative and positive integers. Math 3 & 4 students are working on linear equations. Algebra students are learning slope and how to graph linear equations.

Science Classes: 7th and 8th grade science classes are finishing their bridge project, students use their knowledge of bridge design and forces to design and build bridges. This is an opportunity for them to practice the new engineering design requirement as well as applying their new knowledge of physics. In the past, we have had bridges that were able to hold over 200 lbs! This project is also a way to engage all students. We have had struggling students exceed in this project many times

6th grade science classes are finishing up with creating 3-D models of plant cells.

PE Classes: PE just finished their Ballroom Dance Unit. Students were taught partner dance etiquette and proper form, as well as combinations for the two-step, foxtrot, mambo, and paso doble. The culminating event for the unit was a dance final, where the students were graded on etiquette, proper dress attire, and execution of the dances.

Core Classes: 6th grade hall just finished a project with the Newberg City Planners. NCP had a contest between classes to see which class came up with the best property design. The winning class design will be displayed at City Hall!

Mrs. Halstead's core classes have started the millennium research project. Mrs. Casey's classes are studying how different types of governments spend their money. Mrs. Rice's kids have just finished a book report and now they are writing a letter to the author of that book.

7th grade: Mrs. Catts' classes have had a series of assignments with a hunting theme, they finished their unit with a visit from her husband who narrated one of his hunting trips. Mrs. Williams' classes studied Egypt, followed by student presentations. Mrs. Murchison's core classes are working on persuasive writing. Ms. Romo is focusing on the 5 paragraph essay and studying India's Caste system.

8th grade: Mr. Czarnecki's classes are learning about the Constitution and the Bill of Rights; followed by a lesson on persuasive writing. Mr. Johnston's classes are learning how a checkbook works by having their own checkbooks. The students purchase items while also demonstrating their ability to earn and save money. His classes also made American Revolution picture books that they shared with Crater's 3rd graders. Mrs. Brower's kids are continuing to work on Greek and Latin root words to help get them ready for SAT's in high school. They also just finished the book "The Outsiders".

Mrs. Plummer's core classes have just finished a writers workshop. They are also studying the American Revolution and just started the book "The Outsiders".

We collected approximately 500 toys and just over \$200 for the Newberg Fire Departments Joy-N-Toy program. The leadership students that were in charge of the toy drive this year are Haley Bosse, Karissa Noragon, Daniel Stampley, Shelby Self, Anna Lister and Caleb Smith. Good Job!
