8th Grade Activities

As the end of the school year approaches we have a number of 8th grade activities coming up.

*** To be eligible for Camp Yamhill, and the Celebration Dance 8th grade students MUST meet the eligibility criteria of no missing work, less than 4 tardies, and no behavior referrals for the 4th quarter. 8th graders wanting to attend these activities must also satisfactorily complete their 8th grade project.**

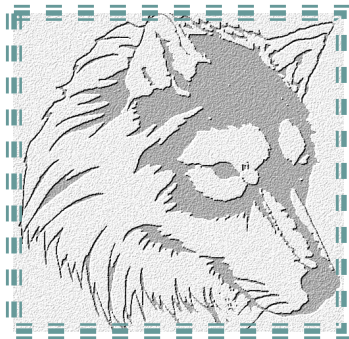
