Roll call taken.

• Reviewed and approved minutes from April 21, 2022 Meeting.

• Work Related Injuries reviewed.

Larry asked Jennifer Marshall if she knows where the uneven sidewalk is at Mabel Rush. Jennifer reported that it has been fixed.

Student Incident Reports reviewed.

- There have been a couple of incidents of bolts coming out on playground equipment, but these have been repaired.

• Safety Drills Report reviewed.

- It is good to see that most of the schools are caught up on fire drills. Larry noted that we are aware that Ricky Sellers has been trying to get Springbrook Education Center to do drills. Ricky reported that they did one a couple of weeks ago, but did not send in the report form. There are only a couple of weeks of school left in the month of June, but try to get a drill done during that two week period. Looks like most schools have done their two earthquake drills. Some have not. Lots of missing lockdown drills. It is getting late for this year, but try to get that on track for next year. This will be discussed with Administrators to get this on their calendars.
- Hung Nguyen asked about making up the April drill. Larry said just finish out with May and June. It is not about going back at this point but about finishing well for the rest of the year.
- Safety Work Orders reviewed.
  - No new Safety Work Orders.

### • New Business:

- Annie Berger highly recommends spacing out and wearing masks right now. COVID cases are going up again. She also noted that Narcan has been added to the list of drugs at the High School for overdose cases. This drug will be added to middle schools as soon as training can be provided.

- Lori Britton noted that many people at Joan Austin are suffering with sinus and allergies and asked if filters would be changed soon. Larry Hampton said they will be changed in August before schools starts. It has just been a damp wet

spring and allergies are kicking up.

Larry Hampton reported from the Admin side of district safety meetings on defibrillators. Many of our defibrillators are aging out and Larry had suggested trying to get on a 3-4 year replacement cycle so we do not have to buy all of them in one year. Asked Annie Berger's thoughts on this. If they start dying, they need to be replaced immediately. Maybe after July 1, 2022, can we buy a certain number of them to start trading out? Annie looked into this situation and it is not good. Have some at the High School that are close to 14 years old. Have one from 2003 still in service. It is holding up but that is way past the age of service. We will try to make it to the new budget year and then look at replacing some. Annie said it gets a little complicated in that we are required to have one per campus and the High School has many buildings. The maintenance costs money to maintain. So the rest of the district does not get them because the High School needs so many. Annie will share her spreadsheet with Larry so he can see which are expiring. The High School is a big place so have to have at least two there that are up to date, but then the priority would be that every school has one that is working and the High School has two.

Dale Seachord asked about first aid kits that are required in classrooms and how old can these be. Most are kept in teachers desks. Annie said that in years past they turn them in at the end of the year. Annie expects that all be turned in at the end of this year. Secretaries go through all kits at the end of the year. Gloves expire and need to be replaced. These kits are blood borne pathogen kits and not first aid kits. They are minimal. If teachers want extra that is great, but the kits that we update are not full first aid kits. Larry asked if Annie would be willing to remind secretaries to get these and have them checked. Annie will take care of this. Bob Harding asked if we are required to have a first aid kit box in certain areas. Custodial rooms and kitchens have them. Larry will look into the requirements on this. Bob thought that each kit has to have a minimum of 30

items in each kit.
