An Introduction to COA



COA is a VIRTUAL learning option

Students attend school <u>in their own home</u> and work through the curriculum provided by the COA program.



There are various curriculum options depending on the grade level and course for each student. Some curriculums are provided 100% online while others include traditional textbook options.

Parents (or learning coaches as we call them) play an integral role in their child's education. The role of the learning coach varies based on the age of the student, but all learning coaches are responsible for:

- tracking their student's learning;
- ensuring they complete at least the minimum work requirement;
- identifying when their student is having trouble with a concept;
- helping the student find the tools/resources to grasp the concept.

Electives

COA offers 2 elective credits:

 One credit is for PE and the other is our general elective for another learning opportunity.

Funds are available to help offset costs of activities for earning these credits.

• \$500 per semester for full-time COLA students

<u>PE</u>

Students receive credit for logged time in a PE related activity. This can be a structured class or unstructured activity (such as going for a run or doing yoga from a youtube video)

Minimum requirement is:

1 hour/week for elementary students 30 min/day for middle school students

Elective

Also based on logged time.
This can be unique to your student and you will work with your student's advisory teacher to determine what will count (examples include acting in plays, music lessons, learning another language, etc)

Minimum requirement is:

1 hour/week for elementary & middle school students

Field Trips and Celebrations

COA field trips are family-style and are chosen so that children of all ages may attend. Parents provide their own transportation, food for lunch, supervision and admission fees. We will take 3-5 field trips during the school year.

Flexibility

- COA allows students to work at their own pace.
 - Students must complete at least the minimum work completion requirement (1 lesson per day in each class subject)
- Those working faster can choose to complete more than one year's worth of curriculum, or have flexibility in the number or days or amount of time their student works each day.
- Curriculum is available 24/7 and students can develop a schedule that works for them and their families.
 - however teacher support is not 24/7 :)

In-Person Learning Opportunities

K-5 Classes

Elementary students will explore science, math, reading, and art. Classes run on six week cycles. Students in grades K-2 will focus on fluency in writing, reading, and math. Tutoring time is by appointment only.
