### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The four small schools that make up the NHS community have one common goal: educating all students to achieve their full potential as competent, self-assured citizens ready for college and career. In partnership with parents and families we support small, personalized learning communities that provide a safe & supportive school environment and a strong foundation for academic & personal achievement.

Each year schools in Oregon are ranked by academic achievement, academic growth & graduation rates. This year, NHS received a ranking of three out of five possible levels, meaning we fell within the "average" range.

Key 2012-13 academic highlights:

- 88% met/exceeded state standards in reading
- 78% met/exceeded state standards in mathematics
- 73% met/exceeded state standards in writing
- Our four-year graduation rate is 78.2%, a growth of 8% in one year.

While we have shown improvements over time, especially in reading, we still have much work to do. You can help by communicating regularly with teachers, monitoring homework and attending parent-teacher conferences.




Level 2 = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
