## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Our annual Oregon School Report Card shares results from the Smarter Balanced Assessment our students took last spring. Instead of asking students to fill-in-the-bubble to show what they memorized at the end of the year, this test asks students to explain their reasoning, demonstrate critical thinking, writing and problem solving. The results provide a more accurate indicator of where students are, on their path to future success in college or the workplace. The results of the Smarter Balanced Assessments – plus student’s work in the classroom – help students, teachers and parents understand more about their strengths and areas for improvement.

Dundee Elementary students performed above state averages on the standards-based assessments in reading, math and science. Academic highlights:

- 62% scored a 3 or 4 in reading compared to the state average of 52%
- 58% scored a 3 or 4 in math compared to the state average of 45%
- 81% met/exceeded in science compared to the state average of 66%

At Dundee Elementary our Vision Statement is “Empowering Excellence.” We are committed to ensuring all students succeed. At Dundee Elementary all means all. In partnership with our parents and community, Dundee Elementary has a collective responsibility to educate all students. 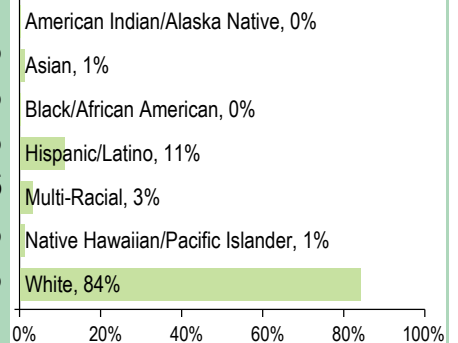

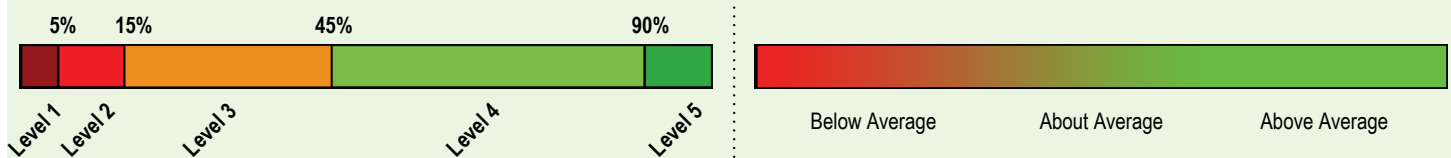
