## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The State of Oregon has made changes to the annual state assessments. The new Smarter Balanced Assessment asks students to perform higher-level tasks of critical thinking, problem solving, explaining their reasoning and citing evidence. The results from this assessment provide more accurate indicators of where students are on their path to future success in college, or workplace.

These annual results plus student's classroom work, help students, teachers and parents understand their strengths and weaknesses, and work together to develop an instructional program to support their needs.

The information in Ewing Young Elementary Report Card shows that student in grades 3-5 scored above the state averages on Smarter Balanced assessments in both math and reading. Academic highlights include:

77% of student met/exceeded in science compared to a state average of 66%

· 68% of students scored a level 3 or 4 in English Language Arts, compared to the state average of 51.1%

· 55% of students scored at a level of 3 or 4 in Mathematics, compared to the state average of 44.8%

We are fully committed to working in partnership with our parents and community to support our students, especially as we continue to work toward being a STEM-focused school. Your help in developing a partnership with our school by supporting your student's homework, maintaining regular communications with your child's teacher, and being involved in school events and Ewing Young Support Team are critical elements in your child's success. We look forward to your involvement and partnering with you.

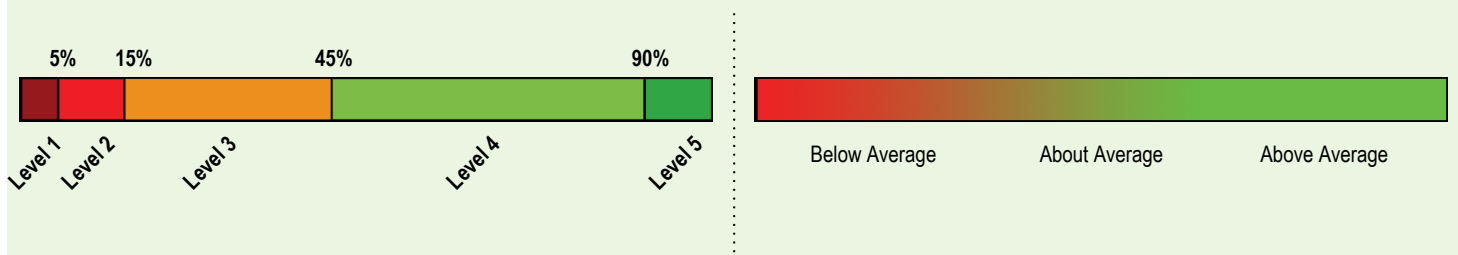
