FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Our annual Oregon School Report Card this year shares our results using the Smarter Balanced assessment. This is our second year using this assessment which tests our students on the Common Core State Standards. Students no longer just "fill-in-the-bubble" to show what they memorized at the end of the year. Instead, students demonstrate their critical thinking in multiple ways, including through typing short answers and essays to demonstrate their background knowledge, reasoning, and problem solving.

The results of the Smarter Balanced assessments – plus student's work in the classroom and on district assessments – help students, teachers and parents build a picture of students' strengths and areas for improvement. Mabel Rush Elementary students continue to perform above the state average on state assessments in reading, math, and science. Our English language learners as well as our students with disabilities outperformed the state average on these tests.

Academic highlights:

- 68% scored a 3 or 4 in reading compared to the state average of 52% 88% met/exceeded in science compared to the state average of 67%
- 73% of our students with disabilities met/exceeded in science compared to the state

average of 38%.

We strive for continuous improvement and are committed to challenging all of our students to perform well on standardized tests and other classroom performance assessments. Additionally our students focus on developing their 21st century learning skills in communication, collaboration, creativity, critical thinking, and citizenship, including digital citizenship.

Parents and guardians continue to be the first and most important teacher in their children's lives. Our very active and supportive Parents In Education organization along with George Fox University and various other community groups partner with us to provide parenting workshops, volunteer opportunities, and extracurricular student activities.

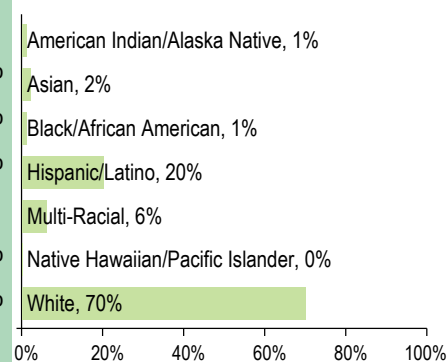

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 5

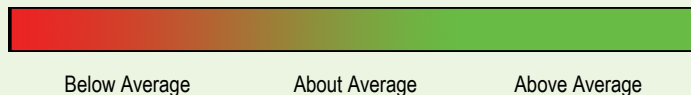
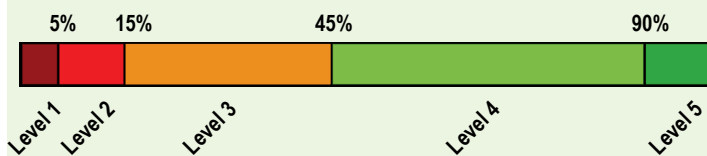
