FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The annual Oregon School Report Card shares results from the Smarter Balanced assessment our students took last spring. This test asks students to explain their reasoning, demonstrate critical thinking, write and problem solve.

The results provide a more accurate indicator of where students are on their path to future success in college or the workplace. Results of the Smarter Balanced assessments – plus student’s work in the classroom – help students, teachers and parents understand more about their strengths and areas for improvement.

Newberg High School students performed above the state average on standards-based assessments in reading and math. Our overall performance is not where we would like it to be and we are continuing to bring teachers together to improve instruction.

Academic highlights:

· 74% of our students scored a 3 or 4 in English Language Arts as compared to the state average of 70%

· 37% of our students scored a 3 or 4 in math compared to the state average of 35%

Many factors come together to create student success and strong partnerships with parents are a critical key. We are committed to increasing the number of students who graduate ready for college or career. Improving our communication with families is central to engaging and supporting our students in the work to produce gains in student achievement.

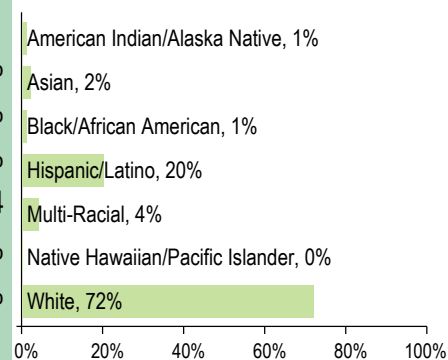

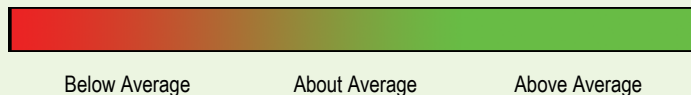
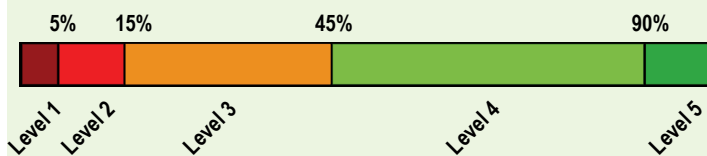

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- AVID
- Extra math and literacy support are available during and after the school day
- NHS ELL students receive direct English instruction and classroom support
- Academic support classes are available to assist students in reaching higher academic expectations
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- Advisory teachers provide assistance in academic planning and homework completion

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

World Language Courses

- NHS offers courses in Mandarin, Spanish, French and German

- Exchanges programs and overseas travel enrich language studies

Honors and Dual Enrollment Courses

- 49 students graduated with an Honors Diploma
- Advanced Placement classes are offered in English, social studies, math, science and art
- Dual credit from PCC is offered to students enrolled in courses in agriculture, CAD, horticulture, manufacturing, math, performing arts, Spanish and welding

Special Programs

- Catalyst high school program for nontraditional learners
- AP courses in History, Government, Language Arts, Chemistry, Statistics, Physics, Studio Art & Music
- Comprehensive Arts program including drama, choir, band, strings, ceramics, digital and fine arts

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

- CTE courses available at NHS include engineering, robotics, welding, horticulture/greenhouse, FFA, culinary and marketing.
- Robotics and FFA students regularly compete at state and national levels.
- A School to Business Coordinator builds and sustains our community partnerships and student opportunities with Career related work experiences.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- Two-thirds of NHS students report they are involved in school activities or athletics.
- Both NHS boys and girls water polo teams won their State Championships.
- NHS cheerleading won their 4th straight OSAA State Championship and 3rd consecutive National Championship during the 2015-16 school year.
- Three NHS Varsity athletic teams ranked in the Top 10 for Academic Achievement.

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
