- Start early. Kids that talk about their feelings at a young age tend to keep talking as they grow.
- Be available. Don't miss a chance to talk with your children even if it means missing a show or any other events.
- Listen. Refrain from interrupting and let your child speak even if you don't like what you're hearing.
- Question the right way. Start your questions with "tell me" or "how". This encourages kids to be specific and lessens the chance for shut down.
- Make time together. Kids talk more if you walk, run, play, or take a drive together.
- Eat together. Eating as a family together 3-5 times a week or more benefits kids in so many ways, including communication.

With an 8 hour car ride coming up in the near future, I am going to try to put some of these to good use. I hope you all have a wonderful Spring Break!

May 31 - 1st grade


We are so fortunate to have such a gifted educator leading the music program here at Dundee. We invite you to come and enjoy your child's performance this spring.
