Thanks to all of our families who are reading our *The World According to Humphrey* book. Since Ms. Mac was a character in the first chapter, and she kept Humphrey in her pocket, I have tried to wear a vest or jacket that has had a pocket to carry around my own Humphrey. When I do not have him with me, students stop me at breakfast or in the hallway to ask where he is. They also ask me questions about the book or give me some details that they are enjoying.

We have made it a point to visit every classroom to ask questions and give out small prizes. The last two weeks of our reading we also added a book give away. All books are in the display case in the main hallway. In order to be eligible to win, students need to write about the book. Questions are posted across from the office. Students write their answer and then tell us their preference in case we pull their entry. The *One School, One Book* program has been a school-wide activity that has helped us enrich our sense of community.

As our *One School, One Book* program ends, another reading opportunity is beginning. *Battle of the Books* teams were suppose to get their registration forms to Mrs. Gray or Mrs. Davidson by October 24. Last year we had 15 teams from our school and our all-around school team placed second in district. Team registration is happening now, and we are hoping for a district and regional winner since we have our top teams returning.

Student teams of four read 16 books that have been chosen by the Battle of the Books program. They usually divide the reading among the team and read, re-read, and re-read while practicing trivia questions for months. They then have practice battle rounds with other school teams. The pool play at Joan Austin starts on January 7. Tournament rounds are scheduled from January 20 – February 9. Our school has the final four teams have a tournament on February 13 to determine our school winner who qualifies for district battles.

Since we believe reading is so important, we also give away books at least four times a year when students earn PAWS for good behavior. If you visit our school, you will see this bulletin board of books outside of the cafeteria. Students are excited to earn a good behavior PAWS and are even more excited to win a book of their choice off of that board.

During the month of November all families have a week for Thanksgiving break. I encourage you to sit and read as a family as just 20 minutes a day can help with fluency and maybe more importantly, continue building a loving relationship with family and books. I thank every parent who supports our teachers and school. We are strong because of the partnerships you make with us.
