Refrain:

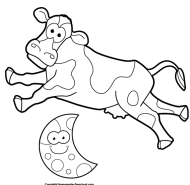
The window, the window, the 2nd story window,

and we threw him out ...(to Refrain)**

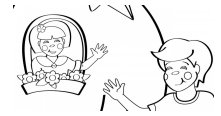
**Baa baa black sheep, have you any wool?

throw them out ...(to Refrain)**



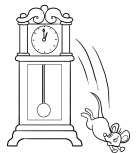
**Little Boy Blue come blow your horn, the sheep's in the
