Dear Parents and Guardians -

Newberg students in grades 3-8 and 11 will begin taking state assessment tests in English language arts and math next spring. A new law now permits parents and guardians to annually opt-out their student out of these tests.

Results of the state assessments provide teachers with information they use to make decisions about a student's academic progress. Having no test results limits the teacher's ability to make the best decisions possible for a student.

We respect that parents have the right to decide whether their student should take the state assessment and encourage parents to be thoughtful before opting their student out.
