Questions for comprehension and analysis:

Part 1: The American Founders

- 1. Describe the two explanations given for why each generation rediscovers the American Founders.
- 2. What does the author mean when stating that, "the founding period of a nation is a time when the fundamental principles of a new political order are ...established."
- 3. How is the founding period "authoritative"?
- 4. Describe the two schools of thought in history and law with regards to the ideals of the founding. Are they as cut and dry as different points of view?
- 5. While reading the discussion of the moral vision of the founding fathers, list the four major tenets.
- 6. Describe "republican liberty."
- 7. Why was America's founding seen as a "test"? A test of what and why? Discuss in historical context.
- 8. How is the founder's idea of American liberty a complicated one?
- 9. What aspects of elitism were embedded into America's constitutional structure?
- 10. Why did the founders embrace constitutionalism? List the key features of the US Constitution discussed in the essay.
- 11. How did the founders view, define, and put Natural Law into practice?
- 12. What serves as the moral and theological(religious) underpinning of the Constitution? Why is this the case?
- 13. Where did the American founders believe freedom of the individual came from?
- 14. List and explain the three traditions that form the roots of American culture.
- 15. How does liberty mean more than "mere self-expression"?
- 16. How is the founder's vision of a responsible and ordered liberty different from the contemporary notion of libertarianism?
- 17. In what ways did the founders intend Americans to exercise freedom?
- 18. What is "American exceptionalism"? How can it lead to both good and bad natures?

Part 2: Founders Relevance to Today

Read the second part of the essay that addresses three major topics of modern political discourse and debate. Address how the <u>founders ideals would apply to each topic today</u> using three examples or points from the essay for each.

1. How big or how limited should the government be? How do you balance liberty and security? What about a welfare state? How do you manage a national debt in a free society? (discuss three points from the essay)
